




What is academic probation on the basis of units (minimum progress)?

In order to be in good academic standing for minimum progress a student must:

- (a) pass at least 15 units each quarter
- (b) pass an average of at least 12 units in all full time quarters
- (c) pass an average of 13 units each quarter

Academic Probation There are different stages in the probation process...

Grades

Academic Probation - SINGLE quarter

Academic Probation **Continued** – TWO consecutive quarters on probation

Subject to Dismissal* -THREE consecutive quarters on probation; may be dismissed from the university

<u>Units – (minimum progress)</u>



* Other reasons can cause subject to dismissal status for grades



What is Minimum Progress (MP)

- Degree Progress Average of 12 units per full-time quarter
- MP will be checked at the end of <u>each</u> quarter
- Workload units do count for minimum progress
- Units in <u>approved</u> part time quarters do not count for MP





Academic Probation

There are different stages in the probation process...

<u>Grades</u>

Academic Probation - SINGLE quarter

Academic quarters on probationProbation Continued – TWO consecutive

Subject to Dismissal* -THREE consecutive quarters on probation; may be dismissed from the university

<u>Units – (minimum progress)</u>

Academic Probation - SINGLE quarter

- Academic Probation **Continued** -TWO consecutive quarters on probation
- FINAL Academic Probation THREE consecutive quarters on probation

Subject to Dismissal – May be dismissed from the university

* Other reasons can cause subject to dismissal status for grades

W24	Academic Probation Continued (2)
SP24	 Final Academic Probation (3) Meet with Deans Office Academic Advisors (Required)
SS24	 Seek advising for UC or CC options Complete Units for Minimum Progress; Complete classes and grades as required
F24	 Goal is achieve Good Standing 12 unit average and GPA of 2.00 for Quarter and UC Cumulative

How do I return to "good standing"?


- Quarter and overall UC gpa BOTH 2.00 or higher






Important dates for Spring ...

- April 12 10th Day of Instruction

 - Last day to change from full time to part time
- April 16 12th Day of Instruction
 - Last day for waitlists and adding courses
- April 26 20th Day of Instruction
 - Last day to drop a 20 day course
- May 24 40th day of instruction
 - Last day for P/NP
 - Consult with an advisor before change to P/NP regarding eligibility
- June 6 Last Day of Instruction
 - Last day to: Drop courses with a Permission to Drop (PTD)
 - Submit a Cancellation/Withdrawal Form

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




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
